**Windows Server 2008** and **Windows 7** is close to end of life, and will no longer be supported by Microsoft from January 2020. If this affects you, be reassured that we will be in touch shortly to plan next steps.

## SECURITY FOCUS

**As cyber security continues to be a core focus and concern for all of our clients, we will continue to share tips and key information to help you keep your data safe.**

This month, we look at phishing. If you're not sure what that is, you may find this blog article a good start: <https://www.rivenassociates.co.uk/gone-fishing-or-phishing>.

One of the biggest security risks is often a company's own employees. It is wise to ensure your team have regular training, to keep them informed on security threats.

We have seen a significant increase in phishing threats with emails coming from a number of seemingly professional corporates including banks, Microsoft and even Government departments.

Do you think your team would be duped? Well, now you can tell for certain. We can set up a

portal, using Sophos software, which will send spoof phishing emails purporting to be from organisations like Amazon, Office 365 or the Post Office to see if your staff would be fooled into providing login details or clicking on links.

You can login at any time to see which staff failed the test. We recommend anybody who failed takes a short online training session, highlighting the risks, to ensure they don't get duped by a real phishing attempt in the future.
